Filing for citizenship or residency is a serious legal process with big consequences.

To apply, individuals must follow strict rules and complete complex paperwork. If individuals submit applications without sound legal advice, they could risk becoming **ineligible** for status change or being **deported** from the United States.

It is **illegal** for unqualified individuals to provide legal advice or representation without admission to the bar or government accreditation. The provision of legal advice includes completing paperwork from the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services agency. Even if a person's intentions are good, the unauthorized practice of law is a Class III misdemeanor in the State of Nebraska.
